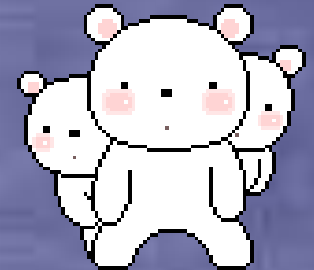

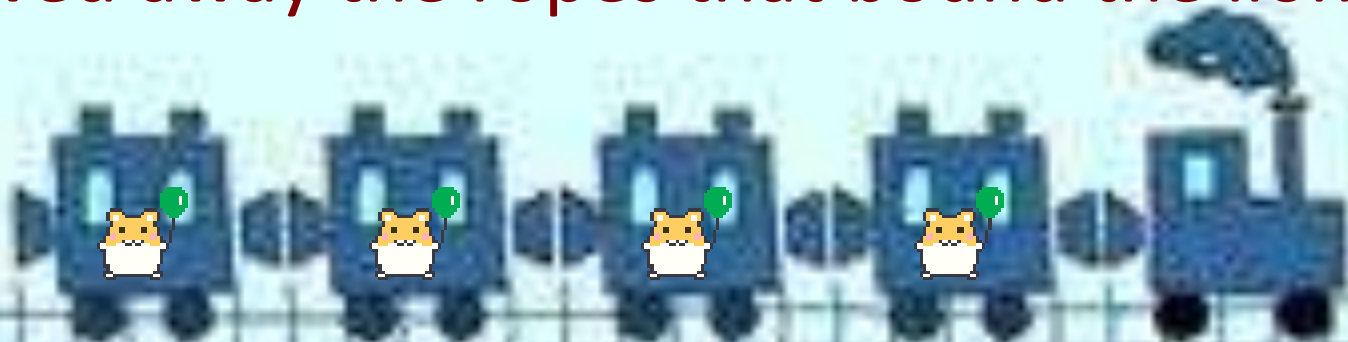
Question!!!
